Introducing the DA2

The new audiobook players, the DA2, are set to arrive this summer. The major difference between the new model audio player and the existing player is that the new player can download and read books downloaded from BARD, the Braille and Audio Reading Download site. The players also support Bluetooth connectivity. They are very similar to the current player but feature a square design. The DA2 has a handle, can adjust tone, volume, speed and playback controls like sleep, rewind, play, stop and fast forward. It can control bookshelf, bookmarks and modes.

Wolfner will receive a limited number of players this year and more players next year. The first patrons to receive the DA2 will be those who download books from BARD. If you currently download books and would like a player for listening, please contact a Reader Advisor.

If you have access to the internet, an email address and would like to download from BARD using the new DA2 player,

once they have arrived, call us and we can help you set up your download account. Remember that if you use BARD to download books, you can have any book anytime with no USPS delays.

Calling All Unused Equipment

Did you know that we can send you a mailing box free-of-charge to return Wolfner audio player equipment that you are not using?

If you are not currently using your audio player or any other equipment checked out from Wolfner Library, it must be returned. Returned equipment allows other library patrons to enjoy the service. All Wolfner and NLS equipment is federal property, so the library must follow the government guidelines. National Library Service guidelines state that if you have not been sent an audio cartridge in one year, you must return the audio player to the library.

If you do not have the box it came in, please call us, and we will gladly send you a box marked Free Postage to return your unused equipment. Daisy Devreaux can either go to jail or marry the mystery man her father has chosen for her. Alex Markov has no intention of playing the loving bridegroom to

a spoiled brat, and puts her to work in his broken-down traveling circus. Unrated. Commercial audiobook. 2009. [11 hours, 27 minutes]



From the bestselling author of *The 7 1/2 Deaths of Evelyn Hardcastle* and *The Devil and the Dark Water* comes an inventive, high-concept murder mystery: an ingenious puzzle, an extraordinary backdrop and an audacious solution. Solve the murder to save what's left of the world. One hundred and twenty-two villagers and three scientists, living in peaceful harmony. Until, to the horror of the islanders, one of their beloved scientists is found brutally stabbed to death . . . the security system has also wiped everyone's memories of exactly what happened the night

Becky and the Lukefahr Ladies: For Such a Time by Shirley Gilmore. (**DBC29269**) Narrated by Carolyn Patterson.

The town has been relatively quiet for the past five months. That is about to change. The criminal trial of Reverend Carl Bergmann and the men who set fire to the Mansion is scheduled to begin, with Bucky and Ian being called to testify. As Bucky's eleventh birthday approaches, her desire is to live a normal life, but she can no longer deny the powers increasing within her. Meanwhile Simon seeks an explanation for the events of the past year. *Bucky and the Lukefahr Ladies*, book 3. Some violence. For grades 5–8. [14 hours, 16 minutes]

The Burn Journals by Brent Runyon. (**DBC06020**) Narrated by Caroline Ward.

In *The Burn Journals*, Runyon describes his devastating suicide attempt and the recovery over the following year. He takes us into the Burn Unit in a children's hospital and through painful burn care and skin-grafting procedures. Then to a rehabilitation hospital, for intensive physical, occupational and psychological therapy. And then finally back home, to the frightening prospect of entering high school. Some descriptions of sex. Some violence. Strong language. For senior high and older. [4 hours, 20 minutes]

Code Orange by Caroline B. Cooney. (**DBC09719**) Narrated by Paul Otto.

While conducting research for a school paper on smallpox, Mitty finds an envelope containing 100-year-old smallpox scabs and fears that he has infected himself and all of New York City. 2008–2009 Gateway Award nominee. For junior high and older readers. [5 hours, 47 minutes]

Game Days in the Fall at Mizzou by Jamie James. (**DBC30963**) Narrated by Penelope Barnes.

Game Days in the Fall at Mizzou is all about FOOTBALL! Captured in this book is excitement and more. For preschool-grade 2. [7 minutes]

Tom Sawyer & The Treasure of the Dark Mystery by Sebastian Joe. (**DBC30920**) Narrated by John Wegman.

All his life, mischievous Tom Sawyer has always dreamed of living life as a pirate - hunting for fame, fortune and adventure upon the high seas. But when Tom discovers part of a buried treasure map actually belonging to the infamous pirate, Red Beard, he realizes his dream of finding treasure might actually come true - again! For grades 5–8. [9 hours, 48 minutes]

Ziggy's Chocolate Bar by Janet Ortbals. (**DBC30964**) Narrated by Penelope Barnes.

A curious frog living near Camp Wallypog heard little people talking about how delicious a chocolate bar tasted. He decided that he had to have one, leading him on an exciting adventure. For preschool–grade 2. [12 minutes]

As Jo Fussner keeps the Marketplace humming, her heart dances with a joyous secret. Jo and Michael Wengerd, a shy nursery owner from a nearby town, have fallen hopelessly in love. *Maidels of Morning Star*, book 4. [10 hours, 20 minutes]

Love You Always by Amanda Stogsdill. (DBC29174)

Narrated by Lynn Wynen-Chamberlain.

Two Jewish sisters separated in a strange country - England. Not knowing where the other lives, each must adjust to her new guardians. Communicating through letters, their love and determination to be reunited sees them through difficult circumstances. [7 hours, 40 minutes]

Patrons who access BARD via the website will soon notice enhanced features on its web platform. NLS is currently in an expanded pilot with users that access BARD through their internet browser. Improved search capabilities and more category options will soon make it easier for users to find the materials they want. This updated version will not impact users who access BARD through the mobile app, the NLS Braille eReader, or the My Talking Books skill for Android-enabled smart devices. When the transition to BARD 2.0 is available for all patrons using the website interface Wolfner will reach out with up-to-date information.
